

## **Dogs on Our Nature Reserves and Farmland**

## **Policy Statement**

Sheffield & Rotherham Wildlife Trust welcomes considerate and responsible dog owners on all but the most sensitive of our nature reserves/farmland. However, we experience issues with dogs that are not on leads or under close control disturbing wildlife, especially during bird nesting season (1st March - 31st July), worrying livestock and intimidating staff, volunteers, event participants and general visitors. Additionally, we experience problems associated with uncollected dog waste.

As such, our policy is to ask:

- Visitors to keep their dogs 'under control and in sight' (Gov.uk) at all times. For most dogs this will mean on a lead. The law requires dogs on leads of no more than two metres on open access land between 1st March - 31st July and at all times around livestock.
- Visitors and their dogs to keep to paths where there is a public right of access.
- Visitors to clear up their dog's waste and take it home with them (SRWT don't provide bins).
- Professional dog walkers not to use our nature reserves to carry out their unauthorised commercial activities.

Nature reserves and farmland with particularly sensitive species and habitats are closed to people and dogs. This includes Hammond's Field SSSI, Agden Bog and Ughill Farm (outside of rights of way/CROW access land).
